5. Matters arising from June 2019 GM

A, Treasurer advised that the money from BASC that should have been used in 2018 to be split between the showdown and the end of season prizes he will submit his recommendation to the secretary and this agree a budget allocated to Mark Lawrence to arrange prizes trophies for end of season (outlined in treasurer's report) Also any updates on the as discussed use of online banking setting up of new accounts etc.

C, Progress on previous grading officer changes to the rolling 16 and colour coding was discussed however the grading officer was not present at the July Meeting and further developments with the publishing of grading information have developed Grading officer to update

D, Re introduction of Scotland formally SARPA now known as STS who have now submitted documents to the secretary changes will now be made to the constitution and bye – laws to allow for this scenario in the future

G, where are the EFTA Mins? Rob advised as the EFTA was adopted as a sub committee that was formed 2 to 3 years ago so the world Championships is now run by the world championship committee and a simple set of accounts will be produced after the event is complete and if anyone has any further questions they can be raised and discussed in private at a meeting, Rob will discuss EFTA and the championships later in meeting

H, Ask Martin if any merchandise left to be used for a raffle etc DR / Trev will (asked Nothing left)

I, Secretary advised regarding data protection that he would contact the information commissioner's office as a recent information brought to the attention of the secretary concerning photos at BFTA events and as per chop squad at previous meeting it would be best advised for people to refrain from editing photos as banter. DR has contacted and will advised of findings in AOB.

6. Treasurer's report

BFTA Treasurer's Report (Nov 2018 – Oct 2019)

Welcome to my 10th set of BFTA annual accounts. Although I said I would not stand for re-election as Treasurer this year, Dave and Trev have talked me into staying on as Treasurer. I must be mad, as I have reluctantly agreed.

The changing face of banking also means the traditional methods of banking, via cheque and paying in slips is becoming increasingly rare amongst bank users. The introduction of a pre-pay system for booking at GPs, I warmly welcome, as I foresaw it would make Martin Calpin's (when he was Comp Sec) and my job far easier. We will need a change of the BFTA constitution to allow for the use of a Bank Card and electronic banking on the new Lloyd's Bank account I have set up with Trev, Dave and myself as signatories. I decided to move to Lloyds because they have a branch local to me and NatWest wanted all signatories on the current bank account to agree to move to electronic banking on the BFTA Nat West account! It is difficult to establish the up to date BFTA account balance without going into the bank branch and getting a statement.

I must also thank John Lewis for his continued assistance in auditing the BFTA accounts. I am happy to report that all is in order and John has signed off the set of accounts, I summarise below.

I have yet to hear back from John (formally) to state that the accounts are fine and there are no queries! ©

The National Westminster Bank account holds £32,419.00 as of 31st October 2019. This is almost exactly the same as last year's balance.

The total monies paid into the NatWest account by Simon, Sam, electronic transfer and myself amounts to £21.067.39.

Total monies paid out amounts to £21,085.27 those of you with quick arithmetic skills will work out this is a difference of £17.88.

So, the monies in very nearly equals monies out! More by luck, than good financial management. This includes the following items worthy of mention both income and expenditure related:



- Two new Air Chronographs £345.59
- 2. Additional BFTA Website coding work for electronic booking in £919.00
- 3. Napier end of season prizes £1,828.87
- 4. Design and printing of BFTA membership cards £599.00
- 5. 2019 NSRA affiliation and additional Bluefin insurance £205.00 + £60.00.
- 6. Donation to Paul James (PJBRC) shoot £250.00
- 7. The BASC sponsorship of £800 which was received very late in the day last year and not used as prize money for the Masters and Showdown in previous years was used in part to fund Masters and Showdown cash prizes this year, as previously agreed (£500).

Martin has provided excellent feedback and notification of monies taken in and transferred to BFTA bank account. I also have a page showing no-shows, which meant the BFTA saved potential losses of ~£1,800. That is a significant amount of money and has more than justified the costs associated with the setting up of the system.

I have this year paid all clubs directly to their bank account for their share of the entry fee, they have also benefitted in that the monies from no-shows is shared between BFTA and the hosting club.

This year the Euros entry fee was increased to £36.50 in line with the Countryman Fair's entry to the Game Fair price. This increased income has very much helped to balance the books.

I remain slightly concerned that now we are grading the Masters, Champs and Euro,s this means extra trophies that have had to be paid for. Also do we change the Euros prize monies to include Open Class and other graded PCP classes, apart from Piston class which has had minimal cash prizes for about 4 years?

I think the biggest issue the BFTA has to face is the hugely reduced numbers booking into events/QPs. This is not conjecture but fact. The average number attending GPs was ~105, with no GP requiring false start lanes from when we had over !50 entries per event as in previous years. I bring this up because I support RobF's (CSFTA) proposal to increase the minimum amount hosting club receives to £700. This extra money will have to be found somewhere it is not covered by entry numbers. Clubs must get a reasonable amount for all the work involved in setting up and running an event GP.

There has been little or no sponsorship of BFTA or events this year, with Companies preferring to sponsor the 2019 World's as it was held in England.

I am pleased to report, as agreed by the BFTA committee, we continued with a £250.00 contribution towards the Paul James Memorial Shoot. This contribution meant that a greater sum of money was donated, on behalf of the memorial shoot, to the hospice which assisted Paul.

In summary, most of the money paid into the BFTA accounts has been generated by the Competitions and most of the money paid out is Competition related expenses, such as:

- Payments to clubs hosting BFTA events and GPs.
- Competition Trophies
- Trophies and Cash Prizes
- End of season draw prizes, (which increased this year due to concerns of some of the shooters, last year it was deliberately scaled back to help balance the books and avoid increasing the shoot fees paid by shooters, this was a conscientious decision made by Committee).

The shoot fee of £12.00 for the each GP, with £6.00 going to the club/region holding the event and £6.00 going to BFTA, (noting the BFTA provides both the trophies and 6 X £25 (£150) raffle prize draw monies at each GP round), is no longer keeping BFTA funds balanced but projected increased cost next year suggests that there will be a bleed from the reserves occurring. The amounts paid in and amounts paid out are roughly in balance and BFTA holdings of \sim £32.5k no longer equates to approximately 2 years running costs (should be £21.0K X 2+ £42K), which I always judge to be about the right sum to keep the BFTA financially healthy.

I would like to see an electronic system for paying for and registering for BFTA cards and perhaps we can decide if we are going to no longer have printed BFTA cards, similar to the loss of car tax discs.



I believe we need to increase entry prices for GPs etc. From persons I have consulted, it seems the biggest reason for not travelling to GPs is travel costs and the large number of GPs if you want to make your season count overall.

In Summary

- 1. Constitution to be amended to remove requirement to have two signatures per BFTA cheque to ease change to BFTA on-line banking account.
- 2. Consider doing away with printed BFTA cards and adopting an electronic BFTA shooter/membership card system.
- 3. Regions to canvas membership for potential volunteers to be BFTA Treasurer for next year.
- 4. Consider do we need to increase GP/event entry fees, my view is that we should.

8. Officers' reports:

Secretary,

This last year for the BFTA has seen some positive changes and I Believe we have had a fantastic year as an association numbers were down although I believe this is a trend which will change in the future especially if we are all proactive in promoting the sport. I believe we need to end negative speech in posts on forums and emails, break down barriers which have prevented some people shooting and caused some hostility and really get behind pushing the word out there that the sport is fun and caters for all abilities and ages and no person should be denied entry to any shoot. In doing this the BFTA will be more financially stable and extra money we can use for better prizes and increase to hosting regions and clubs.

The attendances at shoots this year have been the lowest numbers but yet we managed to pay out for extra services we have never had to pay before ie large lump sum for online booking swipe fees and admin fees. As you will see in Andy's report despite this, we have maintained the bank balance yet still put out an impressive end of season prize table and support clubs and regions in offering funds to run shoots this has pretty much all been self-funded due to lack of sponsorship which seems to be getting harder to come by. However I believe we need more investment in prizes and funds for hosting clubs which is why I am going to recommend that the Entry fee for a gp round be raised to £14.00 funds to be divided £7.50 to the hosting club based on average of 100 shooters per round should give a minimum of £750 to the hosting club. But I would also like to see that club come away with more by ensuring they are really promoting their event through their region nationally to attract as many people as they can to their round and thus help pay them more ie if they want more they need to help themselves achieve it. This should also take away excuses and ensure each region is willing to host a round allowing them to do their bit in promoting the sport. The remaining £6.50 to the bita giving the extra fifty pence per shooter to help cover the costs of printing of promotional leaflets Rob Farnworth has organized via Chris Large and has already been actioned. I like the idea of leaflets the website is great but how do people find out it exists? If possible, I think we should be aiming towards having our leaflets in most gun shops and ask them to give a leaflet with every air rifle they sell. Perhaps a photo copied version to reduce costs?

I want to offer my thanks to everyone who support and give time to the administer the BFTA in particular Andy Slade who has kindly deferred to stand down as treasurer and continue his role for now I honestly don't know where we would be without Andy I know he wouldn't admit it but I believe his finger is on the pulse with the funds he knows where we are at better than anyone and I trust his judgment without question when it comes to looking at new purchases etc. I would like to thank mark Lawrence for organising the end of season sponsorship via Napier and mark basset who arranged the amazing end of season trophies think that's the biggest table of glassware I have ever seen anywhere. I would like to thank Sam for dealing with the admin for tickets for the euros and all the other girls for what they do on the day at events Thank you. Thanks to Martin for running the website and online payment. Thanks to Simon for his role of grading officer and the hours of DIP you do.

My self and Trev have been on a bit of a learning curve this past year we have face some challenges which we have taken on and overcome which as made us better in our roles. We already have experience in the NEFTA region where our roles are reversed but all the same our ethos is that all work together all do our share turn no



one away really encourage people in. Everything else falls in place behind this easily we would like this to extend to the BFTA as mentioned before let's get the numbers back up and get everyone been positive and promoting the sport this is where the future if the BFTA lies in my honest opinion.

Pulling together and doing the hard graft at the sharp end pays off this was evident at the worlds and I'm sure Rob will be saying the same in his report the enormous task of putting out the courses and the plinking range in those grounds and then marshalling the whole event I cannot even begin to explain the magnitude of it. A team lead by Andy Calpin was hugely successful in pulling this off and making the event a huge success so to anyone as part of that team who stapled, screwed, cleared, painted, hammered, trimmed, cut, oiled, stringed, carried and then repeated that process for days a huge thank you. This was a huge stage to demonstrate what can be achieved by all working and pulling together.

12. Proposed Changes for 2019

P1 through to P5 were formulated at the previous general meeting in June for voting on

- **P1,** Adopt the WFTF rules only windicator attached to rifle or pulling of the target string no bottles of water soil grass vape's **Carried**
- **P2,** Introduction of waterproof score cards and specialist pens for use in wet conditions as a backup **Carried**
- **P3**, Blank Cards to be issued to regions for them to fill in themselves once a number is issued by the grading officer **Status Quo**
- **P4**, Follow to the world WFTF Timing at BFTA Events with the exception that the buddy marshal can start the clock for you this is excluding the showdown which due to the nature of the shoot will carry on as current.
- Carried

P5, Remove shoot offs and count backs for all individual GPS and that Badges to be award to top 3 scores in each grade and sillies IE if 2 tied scores both get gold 3 people are tied for second place 3 silver and so on and if 5 people are tied on 3rd all 5 get a bronze badge. For showdown qualification count back still to be used. - Carried

P6 Through to P17 were shortly discussed to decided weather they needed further consultation with the regions or there validity for a vote now it was decided only P6 and P8 Required voting on now

P6, SEFTA - 15mm/1m rule is that the height limit is unnecessarily restrictive. The apparent kill size wont be unduly affected if the limit was set at 2m and makes it easier to set a course as the 1m limit effectively means even a gentle slope or strapping it to a tree can make a target illegal. - **Carried**



P7, There should be 2 weekends clear in between any BFTA event, or recognised annual UK event (for example the NEFTA Classic + PJC). Criteria for BFTA recognition is that the event has 50 shooters shooting FT to a significant majority of BFTA rules and is an annual event.

Reason: The calendar is too compact (in several people's opinions) across the levels of the sport. It does not allow shooters any rest if they choose to shoot club, regional and/or national events and this forces them to decide between them thus creating division and tension, especially when clashes inevitably occur. We don't have full venue support for 9 GP's and thus it's possible to keep the same start and end date to the season and still create the space for all BFTA events and those in the regions.

P8, A GP should provide a minimum £750 to a club/region for hosting GP irrespective of entry numbers. - **Carried**

Reason: Costs for Portaloos, additional parking & rent etc are all rising to the point where it becomes more cost effective to not host GP's and run other events. This means clubs regions either don't put themselves forward or actually pursue events which bring in more money.

Secretary's request that the input from treasurer is vital before vote

P9, A BFTA weekend event (champs/inters or masters/showdown) should provide £1000 to the club/region hosting the weekend.

Reason: Same as P8 Secretary's request that the input from treasurer is vital before vote — It was decided to review this for next year as we will see firstly the impact of P8

P10, The 50p donation from the BFTA Card to regions be removed.

Reason: The EFTA does not need the money and Scotland's shooters seem to have English BFTA cards. — Treasurer 50p Donation has not happened for a number of years anyway



P11, BFTA cards should be purchasable via the BFTA website. There should be a pre-approved list of approved clubs and these clubs should be able to apply for numbers directly.

Reason: There is considerable public complaint by some who then use the delay to discredit the BFTA. This does not serve the sport well when it appears to affect new shooters primarily even when it's shown not to be the BFTA's fault.

- *Web-admin & programming (Martin and Brian) need to be consulted if this is possible, however I feel we should use the capability if we can to make the entry to the sport as easy as possible.
- Scrapped due to developments in online banking via treasure clubs will soon be able to do a bank transfer as well as traditional cheque

P12, BFTA National competitions that use online booking should collect email and mobile phone numbers for emergency contact use (covered with a GDPR agreement). Those who book on behalf of groups would be the prime contact if they did not supply individual information.

Reason: In the event of emergency, for example; changes to a venue etc. there is no way of ensuring contact with competitors.

*Web-admin & programming (Martin and Brian) need to be consulted however I feel from the experience of WFTC 2019 that this should be something we should do. – Voting not required Ask martin to make a mandatory fields for contact information

P13, All proposals should be finalised and circulated one calendar month before a GM or an AGM

Reason: Adequate time needs to be given so that regions can see proposals and react to them with an answer. – Voting not required Secretary will deal.



P14, Split all BFTA shoots into AA, A, B, C, Open, Piston. Prizes don't have to be the same through all the grades but all grades should be recognised. Take Back to regions vote next meeting to change the championships to graded

Reason: If competitions become solely about the top shooters then this is likely what they will attract. It has been agreed before but not applied (Masters 2019) - This was an oversight on the day no voting needed this is already implemented

P15, Piston should be scored out against top springer score of day not against the top PCP

Reason: At the moment despite having the best piston score of the day this score can be forcefully dropped because it might be a lower % than another day's result. In other words a springer shooter winning on the day might lose that result but keep the one where they came 3rd... behind the shooter that might then gain from this. This has happened more than once in recent years and it nearly affected the overall springer title. Withdrawn—take back to the regions Bring back to the table.

P16 Social media & website announcements for every shoot beforehand to be part of committee duties. To be delegated to a definite position.

NB we do not have a competition secretary.

Reason: At the moment the BFTA relies on people outside of the committee to promote the sport. When this is not done the shoots are simply not promoted. Secretary's in put Who is doing it now? And is there anybody willing to under take this

So Committee to put feelers out for a volunteer to promote upcoming events.



P17, Manufacturer title by default in National Grand Prix Series shoots. Top 4 shooters to count, irrespective of opting in or not.

Reason: This will allow manufactures to promote our sport using their publicity. Secretary's input Mark Lawrence has this Job in hand already looking at how to promote the sport next year using the trade – NO voting needed this is handled by trade liaison who has sponsorship in development

Suggested change to the Showdown. 48 shooters qualify They are sorted into 12 groups of 4. Because there are only 48 shooters (3 x 16) then the 3 courses can be run simultaneously Every competitor will shoot 3 courses against the 3 other competitors in their group. Competitors earn 2 points for a win and 1 for a draw (no shoot-offs at this stage) When 3 rounds are complete there is a lunch break and stats organise the knockout rounds. Showdown The 12 group winners plus the 4 best placed runners-up. Plate The 8 runners-up not in the Showdown plus the 8 best 3rd places. Shield The remaining 16 competitors.

The knockout stages If competitors lose then they are eliminated. Shoot-off if tied. Timings Presently the Showdown has 9 rounds because it requires 4 rounds when some competitors are not shooting. Assuming a course of fire takes 50 minutes and the admin takes 10 minutes then the day will last approximately 9 hours. If it starts at 0900 then it will finish around 1745 including a 45 minute lunch break. New timings Preliminary rounds 0900 – 1200 Lunch and admin 45 minutes Last 16 1245-1345 Quarters 1345-1445 Semis 1445 – 1545 Final 1545 – 1645 Short breaks if necessary or because of shoot-offs etc.
