

## **MASTERS RULES 2024**

Entry to the Championship is via the BFTA website. Payment must be made at entry. No place can be reserved without payment. Shooters can attend Championship and pay on the day but risk that there are no spaces available. Please ensure you read the terms and conditions when booking.

Your entry implies acceptance of these rules:

- 1. The BFTA will ensure that the Stats Office is organised, as well as providing all scorecards and paperwork.
- 2. Entries are limited to Current BFTA Registration Cards Holders or registered to receive a card (i.e., has a current BFTA number).
- 3. The BFTA will provide two courses of fire each consisting of 30 targets in lanes of 2 set according to current BFTA Main Shoot Rules. The courses are to be ready for a 9am start.
- 4. A Jury of 3 Persons (Current BFTA Card holders) named by the Chief Marshal will settle any dispute. (No member of the Shoot Jury may be involved in a decision where he or she is involved as a shooter).
- 5. All competitors must be booked online before the event and must be booked in onsite before 11:45am unless arrangement has been made with the BFTA Competition Manager.
- 6. The event will be squadded. Squads of 10 will be identified to the competitors as they book in at the Stats Office. Any competitor not attending the firing line when called will only be allowed to shoot at the Jury's discretion. Both courses will run simultaneously.
- 7. The BFTA recommended marshalling system will be used.
- 8. Top Score on the day becomes BFTA Masters Champion, with awards to 10th place.
- 9. There will be an Open Class with awards to 3rd place.
- 10. There will awards for  $1^{st} 3^{rd}$  in grades AA, A, B and C and Piston Class.
- 11. Tied scores will be settled by shoot-offs.
- 12. BFTA MAIN SHOOT RULES will apply.
- 13. All guns used in the competition may be chronographed, please see current MAIN SHOOT RULES, Rule 4 EQUIPMENT TESTING, for more details.
