

REQUIREMENTS AND FEES FOR THE REGION/CLUB HOSTING A GRAND PRIX SHOOT.

MANDATORY PROVISION

- A main Course of Fire which must be set out to the BFTA GP Shoot Rules.
- A silhouette side shoot which must be set out the BFTA Silhouette Rules.
- A current copy of the BFTA GP Rules and Main Shoot Rules shall be clearly displayed at the booking-in point of all shoots, together with a current and valid Certificate of Insurance.
- A nominated person, preferably the Regional Competition Secretary or a Regional Officer, who will ultimately be responsible for all aspects of the GP in their region.
- Provide a Shoot Secretary
 - 1) To collate & arrange on-line pre booking.
 - 2) To book in shooters on grade sheets.
 - 3) Provide a signing in sheet.
 - 4) To fill in all score cards with name, grade and BFTA No for GP and Silhouette.
 - 5) To check all scores are correct on cards.
 - 6) To check all score cards are handed in.
 - 7) To complete the online results sheet provided by Phil Hollis.
- Provide a Chief Marshal who will be responsible for:
 - 1) The safety of all aspects of the shoot
 - 2) The course of fire
 - 3) Firing line conduct
 - 4) Organising Line Marshals and Chronograph Marshal
 - 5) The pre shoot briefings
 - 6) The resolution of any disputes

The hosting club must provide:

- Toilets – around the communal areas of the shoot these must be Portaloos or permanent structures. On the course toilets may be Portaloos or tents. If a tent is used, then it must have a cassette toilet and the club must ensure that its cleanliness is inspected regularly throughout the event.
There must be at least 3 Portaloos or permanent flushing toilets provided.
- Catering – the committee appreciated that employing caterers can be difficult because of rising costs. If clubs are let down by caterers, then they must advertise this to those attending via STB and contact the Secretary who will email regions.

- Signage – sufficient signs to direct competitors to the shoot.
- Marshalling – the club/region must provide adequate marshalling with not less than 3 marshals present at any time.
- Stats – the regions must provide all administration for the event. To include, lane allocation, booking in and writing scores to provided spreadsheet.

ADVISORY:

Parking should be adjacent to shoot area.

If parking is not secure, then signs to that effect should be displayed.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The BFTA have supplied all regions with a box containing:

- Stop Watches
- Chronograph and tripod
- Target checkers
- Scorecards
- Kneeling rolls and mats
- Hi-vis vests and whistles.
- Cloakroom tickets for the bonus bunny raffle.

Entry Fee for each GP is £15.00 which includes the Silhouettes and entry to the raffle.

The region/club will receive a minimum of £750, plus £5 for every entrant above 100.

Examples:

100 entries = £750

101 entries = £755

120 entries = £850

In addition, the hosting club will receive £150 if they have provided the necessary toilet requirements.
